

Dimes for Hunger Offering

Dimes for Hunger is the major Witness project of Providence Presbytery. For the past 25 years, the churches of the Presbytery, led by their children, have raised over \$1,000,000 to fight hunger literally one dime at a time.

At Oakland Avenue Presbyterian Church the process is simple. During the month of February, families keep a container on their dining tables and place one dime per person per meal in it for the month. The children of the church collect the dimes on a designated Sunday in March. Other churches select other months for the collection period.

Oakland Avenue Presbyterian Church supports the Dimes for Hunger missions with prayers, active interest, volunteer medical and non-medical teams, and a lot of dimes each February.



The Offering

- Is usually received on a Sunday in March (date varies)
- Traditionally a monetary offering is received
