

Pentecost Offering

The Pentecost Offering provides a direct way to meet the needs of at-risk children, youth, and young adults. It is traditionally received on the Day of Pentecost and is one of four church-wide special offerings of the Presbyterian Church (USA).

Since 1998, Presbyterians of all ages have raised over \$7 million for these ministries that benefit younger members of God's family. Like the other special offerings, it provides direct ways for congregations to support specific causes that help those in need.



The Offering

- Is usually received on Pentecost Sunday (date varies in June)
- Traditionally a monetary offering is received

Distribution of the Joy Offering

- 40% is designated by the church's Missions Committee for use with a current mission need related to the work of children, youth, or young adults. In previous years the children's attention Home and Young Adult Volunteers here been the recipient of these funds. - 60% is sent to the General Assembly's to provides ministries for: Presbyterian youth and young adults, Young adult volunteers, and National child advocacy
